

Quilter's Progress - Part 6

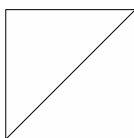
Cutting

Save and label remnants as noted.

- From Fabric A, cut
 - 1 (one) 2-3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut
 - 4 (four) 2-3/4" x 5" rectangles.
 - 7 (seven) 2-3/4" x 2-3/4" squares.
 - From the 3-1/4" remnant from part 3, cut
 - 1 (one) 2-3/4" x 3-1/4" rectangle. Trim to result in 1 (one) 2-3/4" x 2-3/4" square.
 - Save and label the remnant for Part 10.
- From 2-3/4" remnant of Fabric B from Part 3, cut
 - 4 (four) 2-3/4" x 5" rectangles.
- From 4-1/4" remnant of Fabric D from Part 5, cut
 - 4 (four) 4-1/4" x 5" rectangles. Trim to result in 2-3/4" x 5" rectangles.

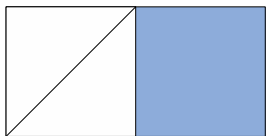
Block 6 - Zigzag

- Draw a diagonal line on the back of the Fabric A squares.



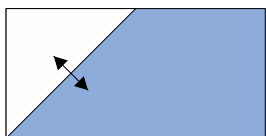
Mark 8

- Align the edges of a Fabric A marked square with a corner of a Fabric D rectangle. The diagonal line should go across the corner as shown.



- Stitch along the drawn line. Finger press toward the corner. The edges of the Fabric A square should align with the corner of the Fabric D rectangle.

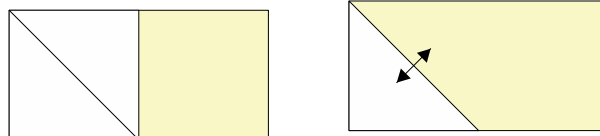
- Trim the seam to 1/4". Press the seam open. The unit should measure 2-3/4" x 5".



Make 4

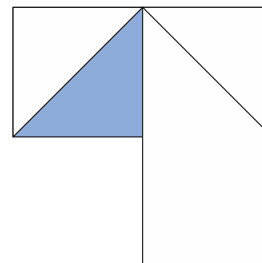
- Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make 4 Fabric A/D units.

- Watching the orientation of the Fabric A square, repeat steps 2 through 5 to make 4 Fabric A/B units.



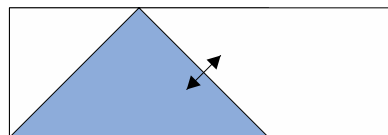
Make 4

- Aligning the edges, lay a Fabric A rectangle across the end of Fabric A/D unit, right sides together, as shown. Draw a 45-degree line across the end of the Fabric A rectangle. Layering and then drawing assists with getting the correct orientation,



- Stitch along the drawn line. Finger press toward the Fabric A rectangle. The edges of the rectangle and Fabric A/D unit should align.

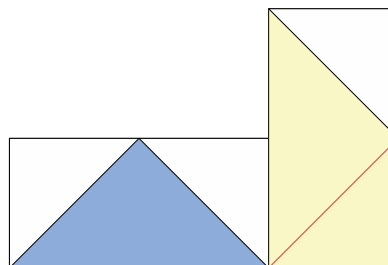
- Trim the seam to 1/4". Press the seam open. The unit should measure 2-3/4" x 7-1/4".

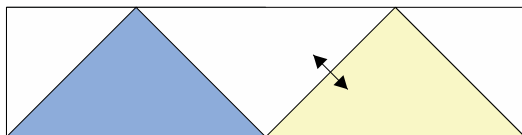
- Repeat steps 7 through 9 to make 2 Fabric A/D/A units.

- Aligning the edges, lay a Fabric A/B unit on the end of a Fabric A/D/A unit, right sides together, as shown. Watching the orientation, draw a 45-degree line across the end of the Fabric A/B unit.



12. Stitch along the drawn line. Finger press toward the Fabric A/B unit. The edges of the 2 units should align.

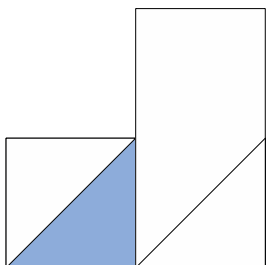
13. Trim the seam to 1/4". Press the seam open. The unit should measure 2-3/4" x 9-1/2".

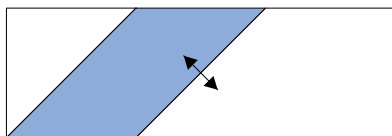
14. Repeat steps 11 through 13 to make 2 Fabric A/D/A/B/A units for the outer rows of the block.

15. Aligning the edges, lay a Fabric A rectangle across the end of Fabric A/D unit, right sides together, as shown. Watching the orientation, draw a 45-degree line across the end of the Fabric A rectangle.



16. Stitch along the drawn line. Finger press toward the Fabric A rectangle. The edges of the rectangle and Fabric A/D unit should align.

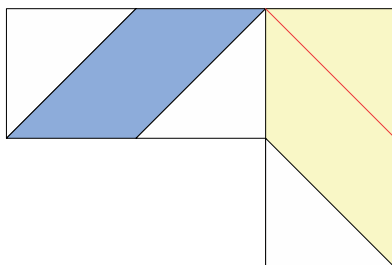
17. Trim the seam to 1/4". Press the seam open. The unit should measure 2-3/4" x 7-1/4".

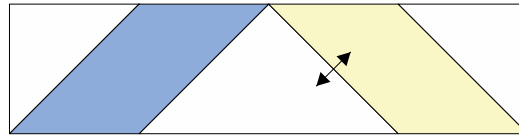
18. Repeat steps 15 through 17 to make 2 Fabric A/D/A units.

19. Aligning the edges, lay a Fabric A/B unit across the end of a Fabric A/D/A unit, right sides together, as shown. Watching the orientation, draw a 45-degree line across the end of the Fabric A/B unit.



20. Stitch along the drawn line. Finger press toward the Fabric A/B unit. The edges of the 2 units should align.

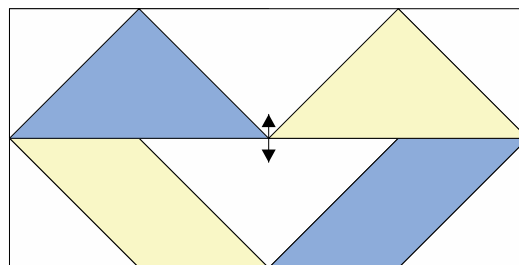
21. Trim the seam to 1/4". Press the seam open. The unit should measure 2-3/4" x 9-1/2".

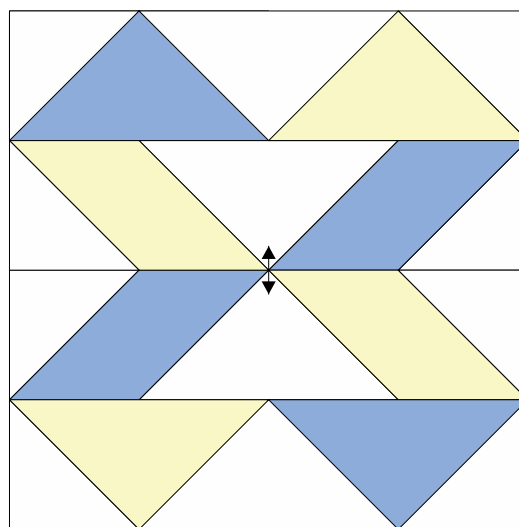
22. Repeat steps 19 through 21 to make 2 Fabric A/D/A/B/A units for the inner rows of the block.

23. Watching the orientation, stitch an outer row from step 14 to an inner row from step 22 as shown. Press the seam open. The result should measure 5" x 9-1/2". Make 2.

24. Watching the orientation, stitch 2 step 23 units together. Press the seam open. The result is Block 6 (Zigzag) and should measure 9-1/2" x 9-1/2".
